KIM ABELES Smog Collectors, 1987-2020

Fullerton, CA – *Kim Abeles: Smog Collectors, 1987-2020*, at the Begovich Gallery will be the first time this seminal series is shown in its entirety. The exhibition features thirty years of Abeles' artistic investigation related to the environment and her innovative method of producing images on various surfaces made solely by particulate matter from air pollution. *Smog Collectors* examines decades of scientific data collected by the artist and its unexpected visual presentation that prompts the viewer to reconsider the air we breathe.

Abeles' art explores the harmful effects of smog and has received national and international acclaim, most notably in the series entitled, the *Presidential Commemorative Smog Plates* (1992). This body of work draws attention to US Presidents, from William McKinley to George Bush, and their varying policies associated with the environment. Abeles continues to explore the effects of smog utilizing narratives related to domestic spaces, the earth, and the human body.

About the artist

Kim Abeles is an interdisciplinary artist known for her community-based projects that explore biography, geography and environment. She is a recipient of fellowships and awards from the Guggenheim Memorial Fellowship, the J. Paul Getty Trust Fund for the Visual Arts, the National Endowment for the Arts, the California Community Foundation, the Pollack-Krasner Foundation, and the Los Angeles County Arts Commission. She has created projects with the California Science Center, Camp Ground: Arts, Corrections and Fire Management in the Santa Monica Mountains, air pollution control agencies, health clinics and mental health departments, and natural history museums in California, Colorado and Florida. She is professor emerita at California State University, Northridge where she taught public art and public practice from 1998-2009. She received her MFA at University of California, Irvine. She lives and works in Los Angeles.
